 - After a few cancellations and one no-show, 23 cars started the rally. 7 ran the Monte Carlo instructions, 15 ran the Picture Hunt instructions, and one solo driver ran as a tour.
 - 4 Redwood Board members ran as competitors Stacy, Jeff, Ben, and Pat.
 - 5 rallyists entered from Golden Gate Region, 1 from Diablo, and 17 from Redwood. There 21 of the cars that entered were Porsches. There was 1 Audi and 1 BMW.

- Final accounting is not complete, but it looks like the net revenue from MSReg will be \$619.20. Total expenses were \$717.30, including an unexpected \$98.10, of which \$76.10 was from the unexpected cost of the large signs to direct rallyists to the Old Lawley Toll Road, and \$22.01 was due to the Rallymasters error in calculating the cost of the trophies.
- One rally car was observed by other competitors (both Board members). One time it was seen passing several other cars across a double yellow line; the second was observed racing down a two-lane road at high speeds to pass a pickup truck that didn't want to be passed. These incidents will be noted in the Post-Event report to be completed imminently.
